


GRADUATION SPEECH - DIRECTOR'S ADDRESS







My name is Denboy So-oabeb. This institute has been my guiding light, shaping me into the compassionate and skilled successful healthcare professional.





It is the symbol that indicates that you are prepared to be the following for those who need your help:


- The eyes of the blind who are sick
